Alumnus Makes Business Connections through Phi Psi

Prom his first meeting with the members of the California Delta Chapter, Derek Leavitt '96 developed an immediate connection Phi Kappa Psi. "The diversity and quality of the members is what attracted me to Phi Psi. It was great to be part of something bigger than myself while working toward a

common goal."

Derek served the chapter as the social chairman and corresponding secretary. "I have great memories from my time living in the chapter house and made lifelong friendships."

Derek graduated with a bachelor's degree in architecture with a minor in business. He got his start working as an intern at David Jay Flood Architect and took on a full-time position there after graduating. After working in the field for several years, Derek and

already started a business, we were able to learn from them what worked and what didn't. We also had an uphill battle starting an architecture

Without those contacts I don't know if we would have succeeded in those first years, but from that we were able to build a reputation and grow our business."

The connections he made through the California Delta Chapter extend beyond his business partners. "Being in a fraternity, especially with the diversity of members, you learn quickly how to deal and communicate with people of all personality types. I loved participating in the recruitment process, and it has been very beneficial to my professional success. A large part of my job is recruiting new employees and new clients, so knowing how to sell myself and our organization is important."

In addition to his business connections, Derek also stays in touch with many of his fraternity brothers regularly, and attends an annual ski trip.
